People and families in financial need are given help with utilities, etc. to help keep them in housing. 3.) The D.C.C. is also the parent company of the PEOPLE TO PEOPLE PANTRY. (Founded by our own Barbara Remon, Ellie Hersey, and Paula Gates). The Pantry helps to provide non-perishable foods to Danvers residence and now can offer fresh fruit and produce. Thanks to a partnership with the Greater Boston Food Bank the Pantry can now buy food at a lower cost. 490 families and 1,166 individuals are served by this amazing all volunteer Pantry.

- 4.) The HOLIDAY GIFT GIVING-GIFTS OF HOPE event is the largest fund raising effort for the D.C.C. Last year receiving \$37,000 in donations for the needy of Danvers.
